<p style="text-align: center;">Another of the Selby properties is a small one-and-a-half-story frame structure built on a brick foundation with a large two-story wing of recent date.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">The old portion is covered with clapboard and retains original window trim and nine over six sash. It is three bays long and two bays deep with chimney at each end within the house. There are three "A" roof dormers on each side of the "A" roof with six over six sash. According to a local carpenter, the interior has been completely remodeled.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">It stands on a knoll with a few old trees around and some barns closeby. It was once the center of farming operations but is now only a tenant house. The tenant would not allow photographs taken.</p>
