The house at 10226 Hotel Road in Bishopville, Worcester County is a two-story front gable frame dwelling erected in the second quarter of this century. The bungalow-type house with craftsman detailing, such as the multi-paned upper window sash, has suffered from major alterations, including the enclosure of the front porch. The dwelling lacks the architectural distinction necessary to qualify it for individual listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. It is not known to have been associated with persons or events significant to our past, or to have archeological potential and is thus not eligible for listing under Criteria A, B, or D. Further research is necessary to determine whether this resource is located in a National Register-eligible historic district.




