The single family dwelling at 10209 Germantown Road, located south of Berlin, in Worcester County, Maryland is not located in an historic district nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The dwelling is a large, 2-1/2-story frame structure, built in the first decades of this century. Set upon a low foundation and covered with a gable roof, the house has a typical rural vernacular I-house form, but rather than the traditional three-bay wide facade, it features two bays of paired windows. An enclosed one-story section of the house, probably originally an open porch, extends across the facade with a central entry. All of the windows, including those in the enclosed front section, have multi-paned 3/1 sash.

though it diverges somewhat from the typical three-bay configuration, this house is representative of the rural house forms of the period and lacks the architectural distinctiveness necessary to qualify it for listing under Criterion C.

The property is not known to have associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under A or B.


