

Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Schaefer House is an extremely small, one-story gable-end frame beach cottage, built in ca. 1940. Covered with asbestos siding, the rectangular structure is three bays in length and two bays wide, with the main entrance offset to the east in the gable end entrance elevation (which is obscured by a one story shed-roofed porch). It likely originated as a deep rectangle with extremely narrow frontage, with a simple gable roof of two identical slopes, which, in its basic form, would have been nearly identical to the house immediately next to it on the east, the Beecher House. However, the Schaefer House has been extended to east, with the slope extended, resulting in slopes of difference pitches. The rafter ends are also exposed, approximating to some small degree a design feature associated with the bungalow form.

The site has been analyzed within the context of the *Modern Era* (1930-Present) within Worcester County. The Schaefer House is located in the south part of Ocean City in a highly commercialized area of the town, not far from the water tower and some other public structures amid hotels and some residences. The property structure lacks any architectural distinction and its setting has no integrity. It lacks the significance necessary for listing on the National Register of Historic Places as an historic standing structure. In addition, it has no significant association with the broad patterns of Worcester County, Maryland or National history. It lacks significant architectural distinction and therefore would not meet the National Register criterion C. In addition, it has no known significant association with important persons or events, nor would it likely have significant archeological associations because of its late construction date, thus it likely has little potential to meet the significance criterion D for listing in the National Register for its archeological potential.


