<p>Ralph Boston's house is a three-part building consisting of two nearly equal size one-story buildings connected by a lower hyphen. To the east is an enclosed leanto the entire length of the dwelling. Each unit is two bays long and the larger units have chimneys on the north side. It is built on a brick foundation and is now covered with white asbestos siding. All windows have single-pane sash and storm windows. It is kept very tidy as well as the surrounding barns.</p>
