NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION <span style="float: right;">OPEN TO PUBLIC <i>NO</i></span></p> <p>The Clara Corbin Farm House is a large, frame dwelling built on a high brick foundation-basement. It is five bays long and two bays deep. The central entrance is covered by a small portico and the door has sidelights and transom. All windows have six over six sash, though the upper windows are shorter than those of the first story. The central bay of the south facade on the second story has sidelights. The cornice has long modillion blocks on the facade and at the cornice returns and up the gables. In the gables are two small windows with six over six sash. Two brick chimneys pierce the "A" roof slightly north of the ridge, indicating an assymetrical room arrangement within. The modillions are carried over in the cornice of the porch which has four square columns on its facade and two against the house.</p> <p>5.
