



Policy for Access to Archeological Site Location Data

MHT archeologists agree that access to site location data is and should be restricted to professional archeologists and those working under their direct supervision, and property owners for sites on their property. Legislative support for this position can be found in both the Public Information Act (particularly General Provisions § 4-350(a)) and the Maryland Historical Trust Act (particularly State Finance and Procurement § 5A-323(c)).

The following is MHT's statement of policy regarding access to archeological site location data:

It is the policy of the Trust to limit disclosure of the location of archeological sites. We consider archeological site location information sensitive, and our policy is to only share it with individuals who meet the Secretary of the Interior's minimum professional qualifications for archeology (<https://www.nps.gov/articles/sec-standards-prof-quals.htm>). Proxy access for those working directly with an archeologist may be arranged when (1) the proxy access is arranged *by the requesting qualified archeologist* in advance, and (2) use of the information is to be by, or under the direct supervision of, the requesting qualified archeologist.
